NCJWSTL has been working in coalition with St. Francis Xavier College Church for several years as an advocacy partner fighting repressive voter ID laws in Missouri. While we focus on the legislative work, they provide assistance

with Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates from any state to people with low incomes and limited resources.

There are gaps in social services as well as systemic disparities in the St. Louis area. St. Francis partners with our outreach programs to fill these gaps and moderate the effects of systemic disparities. Many individuals experiencing homelessness and being released from prison must first overcome the obstacle of not having a state ID or Birth Certificate in order to take steps to be independent and self-sufficient.

As states across the South have drastically cut access to abortion, Florida has become a hot spot for the antiabortion protest movement. Now with the U.S. Supreme Court poised to overturn Roe v.
