Missouri's primary election is coming up on August 2nd and will determine which candidates appear on November's general election ballot for seats in the U.S. House, U.S. Senate, and the state legislature, among other races.



Essential Information:

- Absentee voting Absentee voting for August 2 has begun! You can vote absentee by mail or in-person. The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail is Wednesday, July 20th. You can cast an absentee ballot in-person up until Monday, August 1st. Click here to request an absentee ballot by mail.
- In-person on Election Day Polls are open from 6:00 AM 7:00 PM. To find your polling place, please <u>click here</u>.

Urge Senators Blunt and Hawley to Support the Respect for Marriage Act



Two weeks ago, the House easily passed the **Respect for Marriage Act** — a bill establishing federal protections for same-sex marriage in a bipartisan accomplishment that would have been unimaginable just a few years ago.

The bill would repeal the 1996 Defense of Marriage Act, which previously defined marriage as a legal union between a man and a woman, and it would **guarantee** recognition of same-sex marriages and interracial marriages under federal law. This vote was important


to enshrine federal protections in the wake of the Supreme Court's decision to overturn

Roe v. Wade and Justice Clarence Thomas's statement that other rights, like same-sex marriage, could be considered next.

Now it's time to urge the Senate to do something. Although it's important to contact both of Missouri's Senators to urge them to vote YES on the Respect for Marriage Act, NCJWSTL believes that Senator Blunt can be convinced to vote yes if and when the bill is introduced. We may be familiar with Joseph Pulitzer a Hungarian Jewish immigrant who founded the St. Louis Post Dispatch, paved the way for newspapers across the country and used his influence to advocate on behalf of immigrants. But there has to be more, right?

To help us learn about the history of journalism in St. Louis, NCJWSTL is excited to welcome Bill Freivogel, professor in the Southern Illinois University School of Journalism, contributor to St. Louis Public Radio and publisher of the Gateway Journalism Review. Previously, he was director of the journalism school. Before SIU, Freivogel worked 34 years at the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, where he was assistant Washington bureau chief and deputy editorial editor.

Abortions that occur after 21 weeks gestation are increasingly rare, accounting for about one percent of all abortions nationwide. The doctors who perform abortions later in pregnancy are even rarer: The 2013 documentary After Tiller cited just four doctors in the United States who performed abortions in the third trimester.

One of them is Dr. Warren Hern. He has operated in Boulder, Colorado, for decades, despite a constant onslaught of violence and harassment.
