
In the spring of 1972, police raided an apartment on the South Side of Chicago. Seven women were arrested and charged. The accused were part of a clandestine network. Using code names, blindfolds, and safe houses to protect their identities and their work, they built an underground service for women seeking safe, affordable, illegal abortions. They called themselves Jane. Now that we live in a post-Roe world, *The Janes* helps us envision the enormous potential for collective action to ensure abortion access.

Prior to the screening, award winning journalist Charles Jaco will give a brief introduction about his time spent with the real Janes. At the conclusion of the film, Stacey Newman of ProgressWomen will provide information on how you can take action.

St. Louis has a rich history of journalism that most of us tend not to think about when we are watching the weather forecast or listening to our favorite radio station. We may be familiar with Joseph Pulitzer a Hungarian Jewish immigrant who founded the St. Louis Post Dispatch, paved the way for newspapers across the country and used his influence to advocate on behalf of immigrants. But there has to be more, right?

To help us learn about the history of journalism in St. Louis, NCJWSTL is excited to welcome Bill Freivogel, professor in the Southern Illinois University School of Journalism, contributor to St. Louis Public Radio and publisher of the Gateway Journalism Review. Previously, he was director of the journalism school. Before SIU, Freivogel worked 34 years at the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, where he was assistant Washington bureau chief and deputy editorial editor.

Tell the White House: Make Abortion Care Accessible to Everyone NOW

It's time to demand action from our elected representatives — and we're starting at the top.

The recent ruling overturning *Roe vs. Wade* is catastrophic for people of all backgrounds seeking compassionate health care, including abortion, and violates our religious freedom by prioritizing a narrow understanding of when life begins. Abortion access is a Jewish value, as Judaism permits abortion, and even requires it when the life of the pregnant person is in danger.



NCJW is urging President Biden and Vice President Harris to look creatively at their executive powers and other avenues that the government has at its disposal to rapidly make abortion care accessible to everyone — including people of minority religions and people of no religion — regardless of the state in which they reside. **Options include, but are not limited to, increasing access to abortion medication, and calling for the Senate to pass the Women's Health Protection Act.**

In the United States, it's estimated that one in four women and one in ten men will experience sexual or physical violence or stalking from an intimate partner meaning a current or former spouse or dating partner in their lifetime.
