

## **Urge #MOLeg to Protect and Expand Access to Birth Control**



As Missouri legislators gaveled in for the 2023 regular legislative session today, we know access to birth control is more vulnerable than ever and "anything's on the table" when it comes to limiting access. But we also know Missourians across the political spectrum strongly support greater access to birth control and want policy

solutions that increase health equity and access to healthcare.

Missourians want our state legislature to increase access to birth control, not restrict it. So we're asking our elected officials to pass the following legislation:

- 1. Annual-Supply Birth Control;
- 2. Pharmacist-Dispensing of Birth Control; and
- 3. The Compassionate Assistance for Rape Emergencies (CARE) Act.

When signed into law, these policies will significantly increase access to contraception, improving health equity and reproductive health outcomes.
