

### **Help Protect Your Reproductive Health Data**

Since the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the consequences of apps and websites collecting and storing our personal reproductive health information has skyrocketed. This includes location data, search histories and reproductive health data collected by period tracking and other health apps.



Currently, few federal protections exist to prevent personal reproductive health information from being collected, retained or disclosed to third parties. With attacks on abortion access increasing, we need urgent action to strengthen digital privacy. The My Body, My Data Act, introduced by Representative Sara Jacobs (D-CA), would create a new national standard to protect personal reproductive health data. Our laws must ensure that everyone can access the health care they need without fear, stigma or shame.



June is LGBTQ+ Pride Month, in commemoration of the Stonewall Uprising. In past years, it felt to many like equality and inclusion for the LGBTQ+ community became a non-issue, but if this year's Missouri legislative session taught us anything, this is not the case. Members of the Senate made it their mission to target trans youth (at the expense of other important legislation) and passed two extremely harmful bills targeting trans children and their families.

In honor of Pride Month, we are excited to welcome Senator Greg Razer, who is the only openly gay member of the Missouri State Senate. As a once-suicidal teen struggling with his sexuality growing up in southern Missouri's cotton country, Razer especially feels a kinship with transgender youth who are targeted in our state. He spent the entire session standing up for these kids and worked relentlessly to try and stall these bills. We are excited to hear from him what we can do as community volunteers to support trans youth and how we can plan for future legislative attacks against the LGBTQ+ community.

Prior to his election to the legislature, Razer was a field organizer for PROMO, the state's major LGBTQ+ advocacy organization, and worked on the campaign staff of Senator Claire McCaskill.

The American College of Pediatricians is a fringe anti-LGBTQ+ organization that masquerades as the premier U.S. association of pediatricians to push anti-LGBTO+ junk science, primarily via far-right conservative media and filing amicus briefs in cases related to gay adoption and marriage equality.
