Take Action to Save Child Care



Childcare is facing a crisis in our country.

Quality childcare has long been unaffordable and out of reach for many, gaps that most harm families with low incomes and others pushed to the margins. These inequities also hurt care workers, who are disproportionately Black, Latina, Asian and immigrant women, and who have historically been paid poverty level wages. Pandemic funding that

saved the childcare industry from collapse expired on September 30th, which could lead to childcare programs raising their rates or closing their doors permanently, leaving countless working families without the safe and quality care they need.

The Child Care Stabilization Act, introduced by Senators Patty Murray (D-WA) and Bernie Sanders (I-VT) in the Senate and Representatives Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) and Katherine Clark (D-MA) in the House, would address the impending childcare cliff by investing \$16 billion in emergency childcare funding to avert a devastating decrease in the supply of care that would disrupt the lives of families and our economy.

There's often a common thread in mass shootings, and the tragedy in Lewiston is no different: The shooting turned as deadly as it did because of an assault weapon—a weapon invented for use on the battlefield, designed to kill as many people as possible as quickly as possible.

To protect libraries throughout Missouri, including those at public schools, NCJWSTL has helped convene a statewide coalition of individuals and organizations called Right to Read. The coalition will oppose any legislative, state policy or other effort to restrict access to materials at public libraries; the coalition has the utmost confidence in trained, experienced librarians and

educators to evaluate and select materials in the libraries' collection.

Did you know?

As a result of a Missouri law enacted in August 2022 restricting some types of

materials in public schools, **librarians fearful of criminal prosecution have** removed nearly 300 titles from school library shelves.

- Under an administrative rule imposed by Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft, all
 public libraries must have submitted by July 31 how they will comply with the
 vaguely written rule. Failure to comply could result in loss of state funding,
 which comprises a significant portion of small libraries' budgets.
- Missouri is among the nation's top book banning states, especially regarding restricting access to books about gender, sexuality and race in public schools.

More attempts will likely be made in the 2024 Missouri legislative session to suppress First Amendment rights. Free and open access to materials at our public libraries is an essential aspect of our democracy.

Get FREE Emergency Contraception at NCJWSTL!



NCJWSTL is thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the <u>Missouri Family Health Council</u> (MFHC) to distribute **FREE emergency contraception kits**! This effort is vitally important in the wake of last year's Supreme Court decision overturning Roe vs. Wade, especially in states like Missouri where abortion is illegal. Everyone should have the right to determine when and if they wish to start a family, and emergency contraception is vital in preventing unwanted pregnancies.

Also known as the morning-after pill, or by the brand name Plan B, the emergency contraception pill is an over-the-counter form of birth control that can be taken up to five days after unprotected sex to avoid pregnancy. The goal of this effort is to reduce geographic and financial barriers Missourians face in accessing emergency contraception pills.

While supplies last, MFHC, NCJWSTL and other partner organizations are offering free EC kits to anyone of any age. Feel free to stop by the NCJWSTL office to pick up your kit - for you or a loved one.

interference in their duties, first ignited by false claims of a stolen White House election in 2020.


