After turning in over 380,000 signatures (15,000 from NCJWSTL alone!), the Right to Reproductive Freedom initiative is OFFICIALLY on the ballot as <u>Amendment 3</u>!

NCJWSTL and our coalition partners believe that politicians should not be involved in personal decisions. Patients and their doctors should decide what's right for their unique situation. Decisions around pregnancy, including abortion, birth control and miscarriage care are personal and private and should be left up to patients and their families. But here in Missouri, politicians are making those decisions for us. We can put a stop to this on November 5th.

Censorship denies our First Amendment rights to access books that reflect our diverse community:

- Missouri ranked third nationally in 2023 for the number of books banned at school libraries.
- 60% of banned books in the U.S. include characters of color and discussed issues of race and racism or presented LGBTQ+ characters or themes

Laws and policies enacted recently have led to book bans and harmful regulations on our libraries. **We expect more censorship efforts in Missouri in 2025.**

## Get FREE Emergency Contraception at NCJWSTL!



NCJWSTL is thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the <u>Missouri Family Health Council</u> (MFHC) to distribute **FREE emergency contraception kits**! This effort is vitally important in the wake of last year's Supreme Court decision overturning Roe vs. Wade, especially in states like Missouri where abortion is illegal. Everyone should have the right to determine when and if they wish to start a family, and emergency contraception is vital in preventing unwanted pregnancies.

Also known as the morning-after pill, or by the brand name Plan B, the emergency contraception pill is an over-the-counter form of birth control that can be taken up to five days after upprotected sex to avoid pregnancy. The

control that can be taken up to five days after unprotected sex to avoid pregnancy. The goal of this effort is to reduce geographic and financial barriers Missourians face in accessing emergency contraception pills.

While supplies last, MFHC, NCJWSTL and other partner organizations are offering free EC kits to anyone of any age. Feel free to stop by the NCJWSTL office to pick up your kit - for you or a loved one.

## **Interesting Reading**

Missourians will have the opportunity to vote to enshrine abortion in the state constitution this November, the Missouri Supreme Court ruled last Tuesday.



In a decision published less than three hours before the constitutional deadline to remove a question from the ballot, the Supreme Court reversed a lower court's ruling that recommended the measure be stripped from the Nov. 5 ballot.
