MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT SPRING 2025

The past six months have been busy at NCJWSTL! This couldn't have been done without the support of our volunteers and our outstanding staff. Thank you to all of you!

NCJW volunteers got over 15,000 signatures for the abortion initiative. We trained and were responsible for notaries across Missouri, and we worked the polls to answer questions about Amendment 3. Yes, it passed!

Healing Hearts Bank reached a cumulative microloan total of over \$125,000.

The Back to School! Store served 2,100 children entering Kindergarten through 5th grade from underserved areas, bringing together 70 partner agencies and 500+ volunteers to provide coats, hats, shoes, socks, underwear, and backpacks filled with school supplies. The Back to School! Store will celebrate its 25th Anniversary this year!

The Resale Shop Couturier Sale celebrated its 60th anniversary this past September with a ribbon cutting by Frank Wolff, the son of sale founder, Bede Wolff. 1304 customers walked through our doors during the 4 day event. We sold nearly 8,000 items helping us far exceed our goal. Thank you to Freeman's I Hindman and STL Jewish Light for their sponsorship and to Jasmine Huda, our Honorary Co-Chair. Your donations throughout the year help make this event and more possible. In 2024, the Donation Center processed 9,739 donations.

The Jean Stein Bloch Wife Widow Woman Program convened 4 cohorts, supporting individuals who have lost a life partner.

Kids Community Closet serves 33 schools in 7 school districts, providing clothing and other necessary items to help children to stay in school.

We have also been busy planning for upcoming events, including this year's Celebrating Women on Thursday, April 3. Watch for newsletters and on social media to stay updated on all that is happening!

We are planning the move to our new building at 311 N. Lindbergh; The Resale Shop will move at a later date after the Jos. A. Bank store moves. We are currently in a campaign to raise funds for the renovation and move. If you are interested in contributing, there are naming rights available. Please contact Ellen Alper at ealper@ncjwstl.org. Planning for the 2025 Back To School! Store is Underway! 2025 is also the 25th Anniversary of the Back To School! Store, and the excitement is building!

On October 29th, the BTSS steering committee met to reflect on the 2024 event and begin planning for 2025. At this meeting, we set up two stations: Glows and Grows. Everyone was given sticky notes and pens. Each person was asked to write down thoughts about what worked well this past year (GLOWS) and suggestions for what could be done differently and/or more efficiently (GROWS), and then post them at the appropriate station. We reviewed and discussed. We also introduced subcommittees (Agency Recruitment, Family Resource Guide, Family Resource Room, Book Donations, Hospitality, Child Sponsorship/Partnership Opportunities, Volunteer Retention/Recruitment) and asked each committee member to sign up for one or more that interested them. KIDSCOMMUNITYCLOSET

NCJWSTL's Kids Community Closet (KCC) kicked off the 2024-2025 school year with an in person meeting at NCJWSTL to say "Thank you!" to the KCC liaisons and to get everyone geared up for the upcoming school year. With 29 closets serving 33 schools in the St. Louis area, we are busy and grateful for our liaisons and partner schools. In August and September, we distributed hundreds of uniform pants and shirts, regular pants and shirts, underwear, socks, belts, and personal hygiene items. As the cold weather approached in early November, our liaisons delivered over 1000 coats, along with hats and gloves, to our partner schools. We continue to be in communication with our partner schools throughout the school year, supplying them with the items they request. Our liaisons not only deliver the items requested, they also help put items away and keep the closets organized.



Thank you to our co-chairs Diane Fadem and Julie Hundman, along with our 50+ KCC volunteer liaisons who take care of their closets all school year long. Additionally, this year marked a significant milestone in collaboration and community impact, as the Assistance League of St. Louis(ALSTL) and NCJWSTL joined forces for the second year in a row to secure a grant from the Dana Brown Charitable Trust. Due to the success of our collaboration, our funding was increased from \$40,000 to \$50,000. Each organization received \$25,000 to stock essential items in St. Louis Public Schools and Normandy School District. We are grateful to the Dana Brown Charitable Trust, a steadfast supporter whose leadership continues to amplify their shared mission of improving lives through strategic collaboration.

HEALING HEARTS BANK

Healing Hearts Bank partners with many wonderful agencies. One of our partner agencies, RUNG for Women, invited us, the Healing Hearts Bank supporters and bankers, for a tour this past September. We had a wonderful morning walking around the beautiful facility and learning more about all the resources available to RUNG's participants. RUNG has been a very active partner, and we look forward to our continued relationship.


WE'RE ON THE MOVE!
