### **Take Action: Demand Equal Pay!**

Despite passage of the landmark 1963 Equal Pay Act, women today earn only 83 cents for every dollar earned by men — and the gap is much wider for women of color, earning only 64 cents.

The Paycheck Fairness Act, introduced by Representative Rosa DeLauro and Senator Patty Murray, would deter wage discrimination by updating and strengthening the Equal Pay Act. This



critical legislation would provide tools and protections for women to dispute pay discrimination in the workplace, strengthen anti-retaliation protections, require better data reporting, and help facilitate legal recourse for victims of discrimination. With rising inflation and intense economic strain on families, passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act is critical to closing the wage gap and advancing economic justice.

Women, families and our nation cannot afford to wait any longer for equal pay.

## Urge the Missouri Legislature to Pass the Bipartisan Women's Health Bill Now!



Great news! HB 398 was voted unanimously out of committee last week. NCJWSTL also testified in support of SB 178 in the Senate. Let's keep the pressure on MOLEG to get it past the finish line this session!

While we know there will be no shortage of attacks on women's health this session, the Missouri legislature also has an opportunity to pass a positive healthcare bill quickly - the Bipartisan Women's Health Bill (SB 178 and HB 398).

Last year, a critical women's health bill was just one vote from final passage, but despite wide bipartisan support - including from House leadership - the bill failed to pass due to dysfunction in the Senate. Both sides of the aisle strongly support this legislation that would treat and prevent disease, including congenital syphilis; increase access to contraception; and improve Missourians' health and wellbeing.

Censorship denies our First Amendment rights to access books that reflect our diverse community:

- Missouri ranked third nationally in 2023 for the number of books banned at school libraries.
- 60% of banned books in the U.S. include characters of color and discussed issues of race and racism or presented LGBTQ+ characters or themes.

Laws and policies enacted recently have led to book bans and harmful regulations on our libraries. **We expect more censorship efforts in Missouri in 2025.**

### **Get FREE Emergency Contraception at NCJWSTL!**



NCJWSTL is thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the <u>Missouri Family Health Council</u> (MFHC) to distribute **FREE emergency contraception kits**! This effort is vitally important in the wake of last year's Supreme Court decision overturning Roe vs. Wade, especially in states like Missouri where abortion is illegal. Everyone should have the right to determine when and if they wish to start a family, and emergency contraception is vital in preventing unwanted pregnancies.

Also known as the morning-after pill, or by the brand name Plan B, the emergency contraception pill is an over-the-counter form of birth control that can be taken up to five days after unprotected sex to avoid pregnancy. The goal of this effort is to reduce geographic and financial barriers Missourians face in accessing emergency contraception pills.

While supplies last, MFHC, NCJWSTL, and other partner organizations are offering free EC kits to anyone of any age. Feel free to stop by the NCJWSTL office to pick up your kit - for you or a loved one.


