Tell Your Senators to Vote NO on HCS #2



Last November, Missourians voted in favor of Proposition A to raise the minimum wage to \$15 by 2026 and to guarantee earned paid sick leave for Missouri workers. Proposition A passed with nearly 58 percent of the vote, passing in 106 state house districts (52 districts represented by Democrats and 54 represented by Republicans).

The Missouri Senate is likely to bring HCS #2, which includes <u>HB 567</u>, <u>HB 546</u>, <u>HB</u> <u>758</u> and <u>HB 958</u>, to a floor debate soon. HCS #2 would completely repeal the paid sick leave provision in Proposition A.

In addition to harming Missourians economically, this will also put survivors of intimate partner violence in danger. By removing key protections that afford survivors the opportunity to seek safety and care for themselves and their children through paid leave for work, they may be forced to stay with their abuser.

Save our Democracy: Stop the SAVE Act!

Equal access to the ballot box is the foundation of a just democracy. Unfortunately, some policymakers want to misuse disinformation about our elections and conspiracies about noncitizen voting to block access to the ballot for millions of Americans. The Safeguard American Voter Eligibility (SAVE) Act would require all voters to present a birth



certificate, passport, or one of a select few other documents each time they register or re-register to

vote. This bill also eliminates or upends key methods of voter registration such as registration by mail.

What could this legislation do if passed? Millions of Americans cannot easily access the documents the SAVE Act requires and without them, would not be able to register to vote — and therefore would be barred from voting entirely. This includes scores of younger voters, voters of color, elderly voters, and millions of married women who changed their legal name after getting married, meaning their name does not match their birth certificate.

The SAVE Act is dangerous. It will disenfranchise millions of citizens and will fundamentally disrupt democracy's sacred promise of ensuring every voice is heard.

- Missouri ranked third nationally in 2023 for the number of books banned at school libraries.
- 60% of banned books in the U.S. include characters of color and discussed issues of race and racism or presented LGBTQ+ characters or themes.

Laws and policies enacted recently have led to book bans and harmful regulations on our libraries. **We expect more censorship efforts in Missouri in 2025.**

Get FREE Emergency Contraception at NCJWSTL!



NCJWSTL is thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the <u>Missouri Family Health Council</u> (MFHC) to distribute **FREE emergency contraception kits**! This effort is vitally important in the wake of last year's Supreme Court decision overturning Roe vs. Wade, especially in states like Missouri where abortion is illegal. Everyone should have the right to determine when and if they wish to start a family, and emergency contraception is vital in preventing unwanted pregnancies.

Also known as the morning-after pill, or by the brand

name Plan B, the emergency contraception pill is an over-the-counter form of birth control that can be taken up to five days after unprotected sex to avoid pregnancy. The goal of this effort is to reduce geographic and financial barriers Missourians face in accessing emergency contraception pills.

While supplies last, MFHC, NCJWSTL, and other partner organizations are offering free EC kits to anyone of any age. Feel free to stop by the NCJWSTL office to pick up your kit - for you or a loved one.
